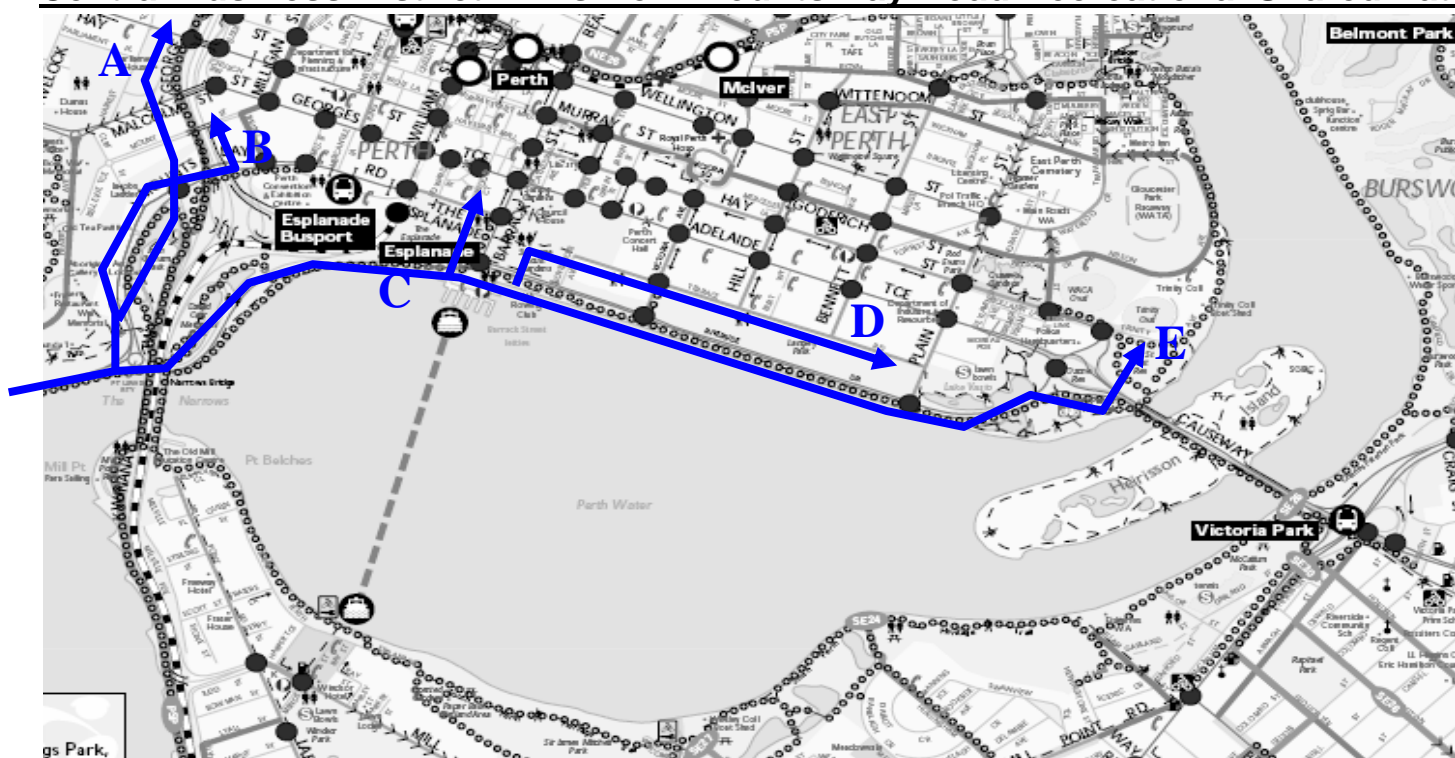




Central Business District Links from Mounts Bay Road Recreational Shared Path



- A. Cross Riverside Drive at the Narrows Bridge and turn to the west. Follow the path around Mounts Bay Road but stay on the eastern side of the lake to join the Kwinana Freeway Principal Shared Path heading north. From this path you will find numerous connections to streets into the CBD including Mount Street, Malcolm Street, Murray Street and Wellington Street. All these connections into the CBD are on road and cyclists should be vigilant of heavy traffic at peak periods. If you continue to follow the path down George Street to the end you will find that this path meets with the Fremantle Principal Shared Path.
- B. Cross Riverside Drive at the Narrows Bridge and turn to the west. Follow the path around Mounts Bay Road but stay on the western side of the lake. At the end of this path there is a T-junction with another path. Turn left and follow the path round to Spring Street. From that point on you can choose to climb Spring Street to access St George's Terrace and Milligan Street or you can continue along the Esplanade to Barrack Street. Please note that both of these options are both on road and cyclists should beware of heavy traffic during peak hours.
- C. Cross Riverside Drive and head north into the CBD on Barrack Street. Beware of heavy traffic on this road during peak hours.
- D. Cross the westbound carriageway of Riverside Drive at Barrack Street and head east on Riverside Drive to Governors Terrace. Turn left into Governors Terrace and follow the road round to the east. This road has a relatively low level of traffic and links to several road connections into the CBD including Victoria Avenue, Hill Street, Bennett Street and Plain Street. Beware of heavy traffic on Riverside Drive at peak times.
Note: There are no pram ramps in the median or on the south side of Riverside Drive at the intersection with Governors Terrace. As a consequence cyclists heading out of the CBD should not attempt to access the Perth Foreshore Path by crossing Riverside Drive at Governors Terrace.
- E. Continue along the Perth Foreshore shared path and turn right before the Causeway to go underneath the Causeway. From here it is possible to travel by path to Hay Street and East Perth.
